Assistant Principal Report

Child Safe

Over the past few weeks I have been including information about the new Victorian Registrations and Qualifications Authority (VRQA) Child Safe standards being introduced into schools this year. CRPS needs to be compliant with all standards by the beginning of the 2017 academic year. We are well placed to achieve this as many of the standards we are already complying with. The development of our new Child Safe Policy and Child Safe Code of Conduct will support us with the changes that need to be considered along the way.

Introducing Standard No. 4

Organisations must have screening, supervision, training and other human resources practices that reduce the risk of child abuse by new and existing personnel.

Description

Organisations need to ensure that newly recruited and existing staff and volunteers understand the importance of child safety, are aware of the relevant policies and procedures, and are trained to minimise the risk of child abuse. This should be done by engaging various recruitment tools, and providing staff and volunteers with appropriate training and supervision to minimise the risk of child abuse.

It is important to note that the child safe standards are not intended to alter organisations' existing regulatory obligations in relation to the Working with Children Check.

Rationale

The Working with Children Check is actively used by organisations and is an effective screening tool when hiring new staff and volunteers, and as an effective monitoring tool on an ongoing basis for relevant personnel. However, organisations can over-rely on the Working with Children Check at the expense of other essential recruitment processes such as reference checks, as well as ongoing support, supervision and training, all critical to managing and reducing the risk of child abuse.

Camerata

Last Thursday night many of our Foundation to Level 3 musicians performed in the Camerata. The staff in attendance and no doubt family members and friends of the performers would have been impressed with the performances; we certainly have some incredible music talent at Camelot Rise PS. The night concluded with Ms Nyhuis (our very talented music teacher!) accompanying one of our Level 1 students on the piano. Thank you to all staff, families and students for attending on the night, a particular thank you to Ms Nyhuis for all her organisation and we look forward to the Level 4 to 6 Camerata on Thursday 24th November at 7:00pm in the MPR.




Wow, what a fantastic day! I am very proud of the amount of talent and hard work that went into the entertainment for the day. A big thank you to all the performers involved within the community:

Changes to the CCR payment method can be made online at www.humanservices.gov.au or alternatively call 13 61 50, give your Customer Reference Number (CRN), enter your PIN (if you have one) then say 'Child Care Rebate Options' and follow the prompts. Ask for your Child Care Rebate to be paid 'directly' to OSHClub on your behalf as a fee reduction.
