

GETTING MOVING IN TERM 3

Let's hope everyone is ready for a productive and busy Term 3. It is common in education to say that Term 3 is the least busy term and as a result a lot of things are put into the calendar. So we do have a full and fun term ahead.

CURRICULUM DAY ON MONDAY

Monday the 23rd of July is the final Curriculum day for 2018. The focus for this day is writing, continuing the work which was started in 2017.

THREE WAY CONFERENCES

At the end of last term you will have received your child's school report via Compass and their student portfolio. Next week you have the opportunity to meet with your child's teacher and your child to discuss progress and future goals. There will also be the chance if you so wish, to meet with specialist teachers. The dates for these sessions are available for you to book on Compass and the instructions are further on in the newsletter. These were opened and available to parents from yesterday at 6pm. The dates are shown in the calendar to the left.

SCHOOL SELF-EVALUATION

CRPS is in its final year of the 2015-2018 Strategic Plan. This means we will be undertaking a self-evaluation of how we have tracked according to targets during this term and then creating our plan for future years in Term 4. We seek feedback and input on an ongoing basis, and there will be further opportunities for this over the next ten weeks. Parents, students and staff will all be able to provide feedback to us and this is so important for ongoing school development and improvement, and creating the type of school that is right for our community.

The first opportunity for parents will be in a quick 3-2-1 survey as you wait for your Three-Way Conferences. This will be available in foyers, outside classrooms and in the office area (I have attached an example later in the newsletter so that you can have a think about what you would like to say). I will also send this via Compass.

BOOK WEEK

Later in week 6 it is Book Week. One of the fun things planned for this week is a 'Dress Up As Your Favourite Book Character' Day. I encourage our parents and family members to be involved too. The students and staff are really looking forward to it!

FOUNDATION ENROLMENTS 2019

We are now taking enrolments for students starting Foundation in 2019. So if you have a child who was born between May 2013 and 30 April 2014 then they are eligible for enrolment in 2019. We'd really appreciate you doing this as soon as you can, it makes the planning for 2019 so much easier.

To make a booking select 'Book Parent/Student/Teacher Interviews' from the Actions button on your child's Compass home page.



Parents are able to make a booking with the teacher listed under the 'Available Staff'. To view the staff teacher's availability, click on the staff member's name. This will display their schedule including free slots and already booked slots as in the example below. Please note that bookings cannot be made from the 'Teacher Availability' page.

- To make a conference booking, select a time and if that slot is free, the staff members name will appear in the drop down list. Select the staff member you wish to book, and click 'Update' to save the booking. If a name does not appear in the drop down list, the time slot is unavailable.
- If you are making bookings for more than one child in the family, please repeat the above steps.
- Once you are happy with your bookings you can print a list of all the times, including all family members using the "Print All Bookings" report on the right hand side of the screen.



FROM THE COACHES

Welcome back to term 3! We trust everyone had a relaxing and rejuvenating break. This term we will be continuing our work with the Foundation team on a Tuesday and the 1/2 team on a Friday. We will alternate between supporting the 5/6 team and the specialist team each Monday.

The core purpose of our work is to develop consistency and capacity within our school, providing teachers more opportunities to learn alongside and from one another. We utilise a range of processes and strategies such as triads, peer observation, modelling and debriefing as well as reflecting on goal setting and deconstructing learning through professional dialogue and discussion.

Some of the areas we have focused on thus far this year include Learning Intentions and Success Criteria, Independent Reading and Writing, Language Experience, planning and development of curriculum. All of our work is in line with the school AIP and draws on the strengths of our teachers to constantly reflect upon the way we do things to make improvements in line with what we know to be best current practise, which is evidence based.

2018 PARENT OPINION SURVEY

WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 23rd July to Sunday 26th August**.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **10-15 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September. The results will be used to inform our current work and future Strategic Plan.

Cover your cough and sneeze



-  **1** COVER your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.
