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# From the Principal

## Attitudes to Schooling Survey

Every year all Year 4 – 6 students complete an 'Attitudes to Schooling Survey'. This survey is completed online and enables students to reflect on their experiences at school. Our results are always excellent; however, we are always looking at ways to improve these results even further.

We are still unpacking a lot of the data we received but we would like to share with you some of the initial results:

### **A little more about Alisha**

Part of the course includes a principal internship where I 'shadow' an experienced principal within their school for a month, and fortunately for me Matt has kindly offered his time to be my mentor throughout August.*

*Out of school hours I try to keep pretty busy! I play basketball, I enjoy Zumba, and this year I have tried to learn to roller skate.... but that is certainly a work in progress! My husband and I enjoy movies, live shows and music, and at home we relax with our old, scruffy dog Koby.*

*I have been in education for over twenty-two years, mostly as a classroom teacher in the eastern suburbs of Melbourne, with six of those years teaching in London. A few years ago, I moved into the Education Department to work in school improvement and now I support schools across the Outer East, from Knox and Maroondah, up to the Dandenong Ranges and throughout the Yarra Valley.*

*The best part of my role is the opportunity to visit so many different schools. Each has their own unique, vibrant culture and the principals proudly guide me around the school. The kids love to share their learning and the teachers are happy to engage with others to share their best practices. However, it will be great to be more than a visitor, I am really looking forward to being a part of the community at Camelot Rise this term.*

We are thrilled to have Alisha as part of our school community for the next month and we look forward to hearing her input into our wonderful school!

## Students at school very early

We are concerned at the number of students arriving at school without a parent onsite before 8.45am. Prior to 8.45am staff are not on duty and the school grounds are unsupervised. Whilst we understand that some parents have work commitments that require them to leave for work earlier than 8.45am you need to plan for your child. Camp Australia offers an excellent out of School Hours Care (OSHC) program to support our families.

## What is Parent Engagement?

Parent Engagement is being positively involved and active in your child's learning. Your attitudes, values and behaviours can positively influence your child's education outcomes. We know that parents, families and carers are some of the most important influences on a child's education. When you are positively engaged in your child's education, they are more likely to attend and perform better at school.

Effective parent and family engagement in education is more than just participation in school meetings and helping with fundraising, it is actively engaging with your child's learning, both at home and at school. When schools and families work together, children do better and stay in school longer.

You can support your child to get the most out of their schooling. The earlier you become engaged, the better it is for your children.

## Why is parent engagement important?

Parent engagement is associated with improvements across a range of indicators, including:

- *better education outcomes*
- *enhanced engagement with schoolwork*
- *more regular school attendance*
- *better behaviour and increased social skills.*

## How you can help your child do well at school

While it is important to stay informed and be involved in school activities where possible, there are lots of things you can do at home which can help your child to do better at school:

- *Have high yet achievable expectations of your child.*
- *Talk regularly about school and the value of learning.*
- *Encourage positive attitudes and respect for school and teachers.*
- *Model the behaviours you would like to see in your child.*

Other things you can do which have also been shown to have a positive impact are to:

- *Read aloud with your child and listen to your child read.*
- *Talk and ask about what they are learning.*
- *Ask what was and was not fun at school.*

- *Help them to develop strong work habits.*

One of the most effective ways parents and families can help children to do better at school is to make sure they go to school every day. School attendance has a major influence on educational outcomes. Students who attend school regularly are more likely to achieve better results at school and are more likely to complete their schooling.

## Manningham/Monash Principal Network Conference

Last week Ben and I attended the Monash Manningham Principals Conference at San Remo. This conference provided us with the opportunity to learn about Department of Education initiatives, undertake professional learning and discuss issues that impact all schools within the Network. We attended workshops presented by Rachel Colla (wellbeing, motivation and performance specialist), Dr Ryan Dunn (Melbourne University lecturer and mathematics specialist) and Simon Kuestenmacher (Director and Co-founder of The Demographics Group). This conference was also a great opportunity to meet school leaders from different schools. There was a great balance of rigorous professional learning, collaboration and collegiality.

## School review - Parent Forum

In Term Four, Camelot Rise Primary School will undertake our School Review. All schools must participate in a school review every 4 years. This is an exciting time for our school as we measure our progress against our Strategic Plan Goals that were set in 2018. As part of the rigorous school review process, we are seeking feedback from all stakeholders – students, parents and staff. To enable parents to provide their feedback about our school we are offering two options for parents. These are: Attendance at a Parent Forum and / or completing a Google form.

## Parking around the school

Parking is available along King Arthur Drive, Galahad Crescent and Avalon Avenue. Monash City Council Parking Inspectors regularly monitor the parking situation in Galahad Crescent.

As the safety of all our students is our prime concern, we are pleased that the Council has taken this initiative to ensure that the parking restrictions are observed. When vehicles are stopped or parked too close to the crossing, the visibility of drivers approaching the school crossing is impaired and this places our students at risk. We ask parent's co-operation in keeping this area clear at all times.

Please remember that to maximise the safety of all our students (and community) it is important to observe and follow all guidelines in place at all times:

- There is a 2-minute drop-off zone in place, which means 2 minutes maximum. Vehicles are not to be left unattended.
- There is a Permit Only Zone in front of the staff carpark. Please do not park here unless you have a permit.
- Abide by all road rules
- Use the crossings provided (manned or not) to cross the road
- Ensure children exit the car on the footpath side
- Encourage your children to stand on the footpath not on the road when leaving the car
- Be patient and respectful of other motorists

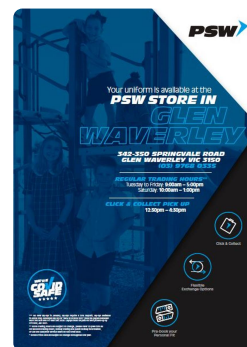


##### Description and educative purpose

If the mobile or email that they enter does not match what is on file they will not be able to proceed. For instances where it is Parent B of an account attempting to reset the password, the system will require Parent A's email/mobile as these details are considered the primary details for the household account.

If, after waiting 30 minutes and following the 'Can't access your account' instructions, please call or email the school office and we will attempt to assist you.
