Every day counts!

Regular school attendance is vital and missing school days can have a big impact on your child's future – missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. We understand that this year has been a particularly disjointed start to the school year for many families and students with our daily absence rate being much higher than normal due to the Coronavirus. This has been the same in many schools.

Going to school every day is the one of the most important parts of your child's education. Students learn new things every day and missing school on a regular basis puts them behind.

Why regular attendance is so important

- Teachers often present new concepts in a sequential way, so missing out a day of school can mean missing out on the fundamentals. It's hard to make up this learning so keeping student absences to a minimum is essential.
- Friendships and socialising can also be interrupted when children are frequently absent, which can be distressing for children.
- Every day that a student misses is associated with lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

What we do know is that attendance patterns are established early in life and will often continue unless non-attendance is addressed.

What you can do to support regular attendance.

- First, there are always times when a student becomes ill, and in this instance, they should stay home to recover. It's vital however that they are only away when genuinely sick.
- To assist with good health and minimise illness children need to have a good sleeping pattern, eat well and exercise regularly.
- Families are encouraged to think twice before giving children a 'day off' unless they are genuinely sick.
- If your child is experiencing any issues such as not wanting to come to school, then please alert your classroom teacher. Working together on such matters is most helpful.

What to do if your child has been absent

- Talk to your child's teacher and find out what work needs to be done to keep up with learning.

Remember, that every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher especially if the absence is longer than a couple of days.

5 days off per year is approximately a day off every 8 weeks

Just 5 days off per year results in 7 weeks of missed schooling throughout your child's time at Primary School.

10 days off per year is approximately a day off every 4 weeks

10 days off per year results in 14 weeks of missed schooling throughout your child's time at Primary School which is about a term and a half of school.

15 days off per year is approximately a day off every 2 1/2 weeks

15 days off per year results in 21 weeks of missed schooling throughout your child's time at Primary School which is about two terms of school.

20 days off per year is approximately a day off every 2 weeks

20 days off per year results in 28 weeks of missed schooling throughout your child's time at Primary School which is nearly $\frac{3}{4}$ of a year missed of school over the 7 Primary School years.

Mathletics

This year all students at Camelot Rise PS will be registered to access Mathletics, which is an online Maths Program that the children can use both at school and at home. In the next few weeks all students will receive a password and login from their class teacher.



NAPLAN – information for parents and carers

NAPLAN
NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM
Literacy and Numeracy

- NAPLAN is the name of some literacy and numeracy tests completed by students in Australia.
- All students do NAPLAN tests when they are in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9.
- Students are tested in English about their knowledge in reading, writing and maths.
- The test questions are presented in Standard Australian English dialect.
- Some of the questions are written and some of the questions are spoken.
- The tests will get easier or harder, depending on how students are going.
- Students do four different tests during two weeks in May each year.

The names of the four tests are:



- Students in Year 3 will do the Writing test using pencil and paper. Year 3 students will answer the other test questions on the computer.
- Students in Years 5, 7 and 9 will answer all their test questions on computers.
- Teachers will help students get ready for NAPLAN tests.
- After getting the results back in Term 3, schools will give parents and carers a report showing how their child did.
- Parents and carers can talk to the teacher about these results.
- The information from the NAPLAN tests is used by people working in the Australian Government, your state or territory education authority and the school to find out how students are going all over Australia. It lets them see which schools are doing well and which schools might need help.

Talk to the teacher if you are worried about your child being able to do the tests.

Parking around the school

Parking is available along King Arthur Drive, Galahad Crescent and Avalon Avenue. Monash City Council Parking Inspectors regularly monitor the parking situation in Galahad Crescent. As the safety of all our students is our prime concern, we are pleased that the Council has taken this initiative to ensure that the parking restrictions are observed. When vehicles are

stopped or parked too close to the crossing, the visibility of drivers approaching the school crossing is impaired and this places our students at risk. We ask parent's co-operation in keeping this area clear at all times.

Please remember that to maximise the safety of all our students (and community) it is important to observe and follow all guidelines in place at all times:

- There is a 2-minute drop-off zone in place, which means 2 minutes maximum. Vehicles are not to be left unattended.
- There is a Permit Only Zone in front of the staff carpark. Please do not park here unless you have a permit.
- Abide by all road rules
- Use the crossings provided (manned or not) to cross the road
- Ensure children exit the car on the footpath side
- Encourage your children to stand on the footpath not on the road when leaving the car
- Be patient and respectful of other motorists


Primary School Wear (PSW)

Description and educative purpose

The Year 1/2 students will celebrate our focus on push and pull forces through this hands-on toy incursion. Students will experience and understand push, pull, gravity and rotational inertia being lead by our visiting educators from Labcoat Learning. Each class will participate in a 50 minute session, drawing together our focus in STEM and Inquiry throughout Term 2.

How to Reset Compass Password

If you require assistance with logging into Compass, you may have tried your password more than 3 times and Compass will lock you out of the system as a security measure. Please wait approximately 30 minutes and try again.

If you are still not able to remember the correct password and are needing your password reset, you can do this via the Compass login screen.

By clicking this option you will be stepped through a series of questions including a request to enter your current email or mobile phone number. Compass will use the information to forward the reset details so you must be able to access your email / mobile phone. ***Please note***, Compass will use the existing primary email or mobile on file for that user account for verification before completing a password reset for the user. If the mobile or email that they enter does not match what is on file they will not be able to proceed. For instances where it is Parent B of an account attempting to reset the password, the system will require Parent A's email/mobile as these details are considered the primary details for the household account.

If, after waiting 30 minutes and following the 'Can't access your account' instructions, please call or email the school office and we will attempt to assist you.


