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## From the Principal

#### **End of Term**

We have seen fantastic learning both within and outside of the classroom and the school has settled into a regular routine with a full semester of onsite learning. Student and staff absences have remained high throughout the term, but we are hopeful that we see downward trend in this in Term 3. Importantly, our students and staff have been very flexible and managed to adapt to the every changing landscape to ensure that student learning continues.

We would like to thank and congratulate our students and staff for doing a marvellous job in Term 2. The teaching and learning programs have been outstanding and our wellbeing, enrichment and support programs, and extra-curricular programs have really empowered our students. Our teachers have also spent the last month writing student reports. Parents were able to access these reports last Tuesday and our Parent/Teacher interviews will take place this Thursday. Once again, we thank our teachers for their excellent student reports. They provide a very clear snapshot on each student's performance and information on areas for future learning.

#### Child Safe Standards

The new Child Safe Standards and Ministerial Order 1359 begins on 1 July 2022. In preparation to meet the new standards, Camelot Rise Primary School is building on existing child safety strategies, policies, and practices to strengthen our culture of child safety and protect children from abuse.

The Standards are compulsory minimum standards for all Victorian schools. There are seven standards plus a principle of inclusion:

- Standard 1: Strategies to embed an organisational culture of child safety
- Standard 2: A child safety policy or a statement of commitment to child safety
- Standard 3: A child safety code of conduct
- Standard 4: Screening, supervision, training, and other human resources practices that reduce the risk of child abuse
- Standard 5: Procedures for responding to and reporting suspected child abuse
- Standard 6: Strategies to identify and reduce or remove risks of child abuse
- Standard 7: Strategies to promote child participation and empowerment

Principle of inclusion: Schools must take account of and make reasonable efforts to accommodate the diversity of all children in implementing the Child Safe Standards, including (but not limited to) Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, children from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, children with disabilities, and children who are vulnerable.

The Child Safe and Wellbeing policy and connected policies are reviewed in consultation with staff, students, and parents. The graphic below shows you the number of policies that connect with the Child Safe standards.





Our Education Sub Committee and School Council are in the process of reviewing and updating our existing policies. Once updated, we will share these with the school community via our school's website.

After learning about planning, we learnt about stakes and obstacles that the character might face. We learnt that knowing our character more helps us understand what they are feeling and facing which is important to include whiles writing about stakes and obstacles.

Once we had chosen our final topic, we began to write up a character diamond to develop our protagonist further. We did this by identifying strengths, weaknesses, fears, goals, problems and special skills.

Then we began to figure out the main points by using a story map template. In the story map we introduced characters, the main problem, crisis, climax and resolution. We divided our story map into three categories: Beginning (act one), middle (act two) and end (act three).

Overall, everyone had a great time and learned lots.

### Parking around the school

Parking is available along King Arthur Drive, Galahad Crescent and Avalon Avenue. Monash City Council Parking Inspectors regularly monitor the parking situation in Galahad Crescent. As the safety of all our students is our prime concern, we are pleased that the Council has taken this initiative to ensure that the parking restrictions are observed. When vehicles are stopped or parked too close to the crossing, the visibility of drivers approaching the school crossing is impaired and this places our students at risk. We ask parent's co-operation in keeping this area clear at all times.

Please remember that to maximise the safety of all our students (and community) it is important to observe and follow all guidelines in place at all times:

- There is a 2-minute drop-off zone in place, which means <u>2 minutes maximum</u>.
   Vehicles are not to be left unattended.
- There is a Permit Only Zone in front of the staff carpark. Please do not park here unless you have a permit.
- Abide by all road rules
- Use the crossings provided (manned or not) to cross the road
- Ensure children exit the car on the footpath side
- Encourage your children to stand on the footpath not on the road when leaving the car
- Be patient and respectful of other motorists



You can now Decline events on Compass

If for some reason your child is unable to attend an event there is now a Decline button on Compass. Please use this function if required for future events.



## How to Reset Compass Password

If you require assistance with logging into Compass, you may have tried your password more than 3 times and Compass will lock you out of the system as a security measure. Please wait approximately 30 minutes and try again.



If you are still not able to remember the correct password and are needing your password reset, you can do this via the Compass login screen.

By clicking this option you will be stepped through a series of questions including a request to enter your current email or mobile phone number. Compass will use the information to forward the reset details so you must be able to access your email / mobile phone. Please note, Compass will use the existing primary email or mobile on file for that user account for verification before completing a password reset for the user. If the mobile or email that they enter does not match what is on file they will not be able to proceed. For instances where it is Parent B of an account attempting to reset the password, the system will require Parent A's email/mobile as these details are considered the primary details for the household account.

If, after waiting 30 minutes and following the 'Cant access your account' instructions, please call or email the school office and we will attempt to assist you.
