From the Principal

Principal's Report

What another big year it has been yet again at Camelot Rise Primary School. The 2021 school year is ending and Christmas is just around the corner.

This year has followed a similar path to 2020 and at this time of year we need to take stock and reflect on what has been achieved. The 'unknowns' of this year has made planning difficult, and we have become increasingly flexible and adaptable. The Year 6 Camp that will occur next week is a great example of this. It appeared for a while that the Year 6 cohort

would again miss out on school camp, however, due to the flexibility and persistence of our staff we are able to provide an opportunity for this camp to proceed.

We are pleased that our Year 6 Graduation ceremony can proceed tomorrow night. This is another example of how the students and staff have worked together within the ever-changing guidelines to make this event memorable for the students and their parents.

This year more than ever the partnership between home and school has been so vital in providing educational opportunities to our students. The format of our 'Remote Learning' program was extremely successful with classes being taught daily, teacher directed focus groups, one to one instruction, feedback on work and time spent with their peers. All of these factors contributed to a very successful 'Remote Learning' program at Camelot Rise Primary School. The feedback we received was overwhelming with many parents commenting how wonderful the school has been during such challenging times.

I thank you for all your efforts in supporting the students throughout the year and for your support of the school as we have navigated through the year.

We would also like to thank the wonderful staff. The challenge of educating our students is something which we take seriously and the passion that our staff have to make a difference to each and every student is inspiring. This year they have delivered something that none of us could have imagined at the beginning of the year, and I know that they are proud of what the students have achieved this year.

Our goal for 2022 remains to ensure that all our students are achieving their best possible outcomes and we have already started working towards that goal. Your children's new teachers will be briefed on each child's point of need for the start of next year as part of our 'Teacher handover / Transition to 2022'.

Early in the new school year, we will offer our 'Getting to Know You Interviews' where parents and teachers can discuss their goals for the year ahead. We will also conduct Parent Information Nights in Term One where parents can learn about what to expect in each year level throughout the school.

Given the success of this year's WebEx interviews, we will most likely offer both an online and an in-person option next year.

Farewell to the Class of 2021!

Our 2021 Year Six students are now in their final two weeks of primary school. We are very excited that this cohort of students will be attending camp next week. This cohort were not able to attend their Year 5 camp and we were so hopeful that a camp this year could proceed for them. Being on a school camp will be a different way to finish off their primary school life!

It is an exciting time for any young person to move from the sanctuary of their primary school and take the challenge of entering secondary school. We would like to wish them all a very fond farewell from Camelot Rise Primary School. Over the last two years, unlike any other, they have missed out on far too many milestones, but we are so proud of their resilience and their recognition that the sacrifice was for the greater good. We know our school has provided these students with the skills and confidence to take on any challenge they face in the coming years.

We would also like to farewell all the families that are departing Camelot Rise Primary School for a variety of reasons. We hope that wherever you go you will look back fondly at your time at Camelot Rise Primary School.

End of Year assembly

Parking around the school

Parking is available along King Arthur Drive, Galahad Crescent and Avalon Avenue. Monash City Council Parking Inspectors regularly monitor the parking situation in Galahad Crescent. As the safety of all our students is our prime concern, we are pleased that the Council has taken this initiative to ensure that the parking restrictions are observed. When vehicles are stopped or parked too close to the crossing, the visibility of drivers approaching the school crossing is impaired and this places our students at risk. We ask parent's co-operation in keeping this area clear at all times.

Please remember that to maximise the safety of all our students (and community) it is important to observe and follow all guidelines in place at all times:

- There is a 2-minute drop-off zone in place, which means 2 minutes maximum. Vehicles are not to be left unattended.
- There is a Permit Only Zone in front of the staff carpark. Please do not park here unless you have a permit.
- Abide by all road rules
- Use the crossings provided (manned or not) to cross the road
- Ensure children exit the car on the footpath side

- Encourage your children to stand on the footpath not on the road when leaving the car
- Be patient and respectful of other motorists


Primary School Wear (PSW)


1 Event information

Description and educative purpose

The Year 1/2 students will celebrate our focus on push and pull forces through this hands-on toy incursion. Students will experience and understand push, pull, gravity and rotational inertia being lead by our visiting educators from Labcoat Learning. Each class will participate in a 50 minute session, drawing together our focus in STEM and Inquiry throughout Term 2.

How to Reset Compass Password

If you require assistance with logging into Compass, you may have tried your password more than 3 times and Compass will lock you out of the system as a security measure. Please wait approximately 30 minutes and try again.



If you are still not able to remember the correct password and are needing your password reset, you can do this via the Compass login screen.

By clicking this option you will be stepped through a series of questions including a request to enter your current email or mobile phone number. Compass will use the information to forward the reset details so you must be able to access your email / mobile phone. ***Please note***, Compass will use the existing primary email or mobile on file for that user account for verification before completing a password reset for the user. If the mobile or email that they enter does not match what is on file they will not be able to proceed. For instances where it is Parent B of an account attempting to reset the password, the system will require Parent A's email/mobile as these details are considered the primary details for the household account.

If, after waiting 30 minutes and following the 'Can't access your account' instructions, please call or email the school office and we will attempt to assist you.

We are collecting Bread tags for Wheelchairs!!!




