Year 1 and 2 Incursion

The Year 1 and 2 students took part in an incursion yesterday. Please see below for a recount of the day written by the Year 2 students with some input from their teachers.

Body Incursion

Yesterday, on the 4th of April, Level 1 and 2 had our much anticipated body incursion in the Stem Room. Lydia, a scientist from Swinburne University, showed us how our digestive system works and how to keep it healthy.

During the incursion we learned:

- About keeping our bodies healthy by eating crunchy vegetables, fruits and nuts to help digestion.
- How peristalsis works and how it moves things around our body.
- Not to talk whilst eating as it will open the windpipe and food will go down there instead of the oesophagus, causing choking.
- How poo is made.

She also let us touch a cow's tongue, stomach and intestines.

It was a fun and interesting incursion and we learned a lot about our fascinating bodies.

Student Excellence Program at Camelot Rise Primary School

Each term, the Department of Education invites high achievers to participate in their English and Maths programs. This is a virtual extension program that explores topics that challenge their number and pattern decoding.

In Term 1 we have six students from Year 6 participating in the Victorian High Ability Program (VHAP) - Maths. Congratulations to Aiden, Mitchell, Jordan, Finn, Kyara and Ashen – keep up the great work! These students will join a face-to-face masterclass with neighbouring schools next term for half a day.



This term we have also running Maths sessions from the Victorian Challenge and Enrichment Series (VCES). Year 5s and Year 6s have been playing with 'Crazy Cubes' in a graph theory exercise.

In this session we were given 4 cubes, each with colours on them. We had to line them up and make sure that each row only has one of each colour. They showed us how to use the method of graph theory. Some people got the puzzle by using trial and error, but most people failed. It was very fun trying to figure out the puzzle and finding the different combinations.

Parking around the school

Parking is available along King Arthur Drive, Galahad Crescent and Avalon Avenue. Monash City Council Parking Inspectors regularly monitor the parking situation in Galahad Crescent. As the safety of all our students is our prime concern, we are pleased that the Council has taken this initiative to ensure that the parking restrictions are observed. When vehicles are stopped or parked too close to the crossing, the visibility of drivers approaching the school crossing is impaired and this places our students at risk. We ask parent's co-operation in keeping this area clear at all times.

Please remember that to maximise the safety of all our students (and community) it is important to observe and follow all guidelines in place at all times:

- There is a 2-minute drop-off zone in place, which means 2 minutes maximum. Vehicles are not to be left unattended.
- There is a Permit Only Zone in front of the staff carpark. Please do not park here unless you have a permit.
- Abide by all road rules
- Use the crossings provided (manned or not) to cross the road
- Ensure children exit the car on the footpath side
- Encourage your children to stand on the footpath not on the road when leaving the car


1 Event information

Compass will use the information to forward the reset details so you must be able to access your email / mobile phone. ***Please note***, Compass will use the existing primary email or mobile on file for that user account for verification before completing a password reset for the user. If the mobile or email that they enter does not match what is on file they will not be able to proceed. For instances where it is Parent B of an account attempting to reset the password, the system will require Parent A's email/mobile as these details are considered the primary details for the household account.


If, after waiting 30 minutes and following the 'Can't access your account' instructions, please call or email the school office and we will attempt to assist you.
