We express our thanks to the teaching and education support staff for their commitment to provide the best educational opportunities for our students; and thank the parents of our community for continuing to support us in the development of our young people.

We also would like to acknowledge the staff members who worked through their school break to ensure that their classes are ready to return. We are confident this will be an excellent term for the students, and they will thoroughly enjoy the next few months.

With most students returning to school following the holidays, it is important to reiterate the importance of attending school each school day, as every day matters. Of course, there have been many, many communications sent home to families over the past two years outlining the importance of staff and students staying home when unwell, especially when exhibiting COVID-19 related symptoms. This message remains as pertinent now as in the past and must be followed by everyone; thank you!

It is true that we are still very much in the midst of the current pandemic, which has now gone on for longer than most of us would have anticipated. That said, our community have worked exceedingly well together over the past couple of years, adopting a collaborative mindset, and demonstrating commendable adaptability and genuine respect for others, which I'm sure will continue.

Last week, several media outlets presented stories on the extreme stress that schools are currently under, especially in relation to maintaining effective staffing levels, and keeping as many programs running as possible. Camelot rise Primary School is not exempt from these pressures, and it has been organisationally very tricky to navigate through changes.

I think it would be fair to say we might be in for a challenging time over Term 3 as the current 3rd wave of COVID spreads. As always, we appreciate the care and support of our whole school community and will do everything possible to protect the wellbeing of our students.

We thank everyone for your support and understanding as we continue to do our best to ensure all students remain in the classes and attend all specialist classes.

## Covid Update

From Saturday 25 June, all school staff (including casual relief teachers (CRT's), pre-service teachers, and Outside School Hours Care staff), volunteers, contractors and visitors are no longer required to meet COVID-19 vaccination requirements to attend work.

This will not cause any change to our school. In terms of **Rapid antigen testing**, the Victorian Government is providing up to three further deliveries of RATs in Term 3 and again in Term 4 to schools. These will be distributed as soon as we receive them. It is recommended that rapid antigen tests are used by students and staff when symptomatic. Household contacts are required to test negative using a rapid antigen test if they are attending or working at a school onsite.

As part of the changes, from 11.59pm Friday 24 June 2022, parents and carers who have COVID-19 can transport their non-COVID-19 children via private vehicle to their primary or secondary school when an alternative person is not available to assist. This will include school holiday programs held on school grounds.

This means that parents and carers will be able to leave COVID self-isolation to take their non-COVID-19 child to school or school holiday programs via a private vehicle.

The parent or carer must travel directly to and from the school only. They must always remain in the vehicle unless it is reasonably necessary to leave the vehicle to walk the child to and from the entrance of the school safely. They must always wear a face mask.

Speaking of masks, they are now recommended in all indoor settings. It is up to individual families to decide if their child wears a mask to school.

## The School Production

There is a lot to look forward to across Term 3 with School Production high on our list of exciting learning opportunities. We are very much looking forward to having this event, which has not been held for the past couple of years. The production will be performed on Tuesday 30 and Wednesday 31 August at the Alexander Theatre at Monash University. Please save those dates in your calendars. All Children will do two performances of the show.

All classes will once again participate in the production through a dancing/singing performance. Costumes, lights and a vibrant soundtrack will also be part of the fun. We run a

very tight production schedule so that this event does not interfere with other learning programs. Students have been learning songs and dances as part of their Performing Arts classes and the main cast members have given up many lunchtimes to rehearse and learn their roles for our production.



For those families who have never had the experience of a Camelot Rise Production, it is a fantastic event, and the performances are an incredibly special moment for all. Information about ticket sales will be shared with the school community in the next few weeks.

Thanks to Ms Deb Hong, our Performing Arts teacher, for coordinating and directing this production.

### **Professional Practice days**

The Victorian Government Schools Agreement is currently before the Fair Work Commission.

If approved by the commission, the agreement states that teachers will be entitled to 2 further professional practice days in 2022, 2 professional practice days in 2023 and one professional practice day in 2024 and beyond.

The department received very positive feedback from principals in relation to the option for schools to hold a common professional practice day in Term 2, 2022, including staff electing to use the day to collaborate with their colleagues.

In anticipation of this new agreement being approved by the Fair Work Commission, Camelot Rise Primary School will be holding two more professional practice days in 2022.

No students will be required at school on these days.

As a staff we are looking at the best way to utilise these days in relation to teacher planning, professional learning, moderating of student work and report writing. Once staff determine the most suitable focus and timeline for these dates, we present these dates to School Council. These dates will then need to be approved / rejected by School Council prior to the school community being informed of these dates if they are approved

When selecting these dates, we try to give as much time as possible to enable parents to potentially arrange their work schedules. Once we can confirm these dates we will ask if Camp Australia can provide an Out of School Hours service on these days.

We are aware that this is an impact on families, however, please be assured we endeavour to inform of these dates as soon as possible to provide you with time to make plans for the supervision and care of your children.

We thank you for your ongoing support.

### **Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)**

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2020).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that

no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage, and disclosure of personal information. ### Parking around the school

Parking is available along King Arthur Drive, Galahad Crescent and Avalon Avenue. Monash City Council Parking Inspectors regularly monitor the parking situation in Galahad Crescent. As the safety of all our students is our prime concern, we are pleased that the Council has taken this initiative to ensure that the parking restrictions are observed. When vehicles are stopped or parked too close to the crossing, the visibility of drivers approaching the school crossing is impaired and this places our students at risk. We ask parent's co-operation in keeping this area clear at all times.

Please remember that to maximise the safety of all our students (and community) it is important to observe and follow all guidelines in place at all times:

- There is a 2-minute drop-off zone in place, which means 2 minutes maximum.  
Vehicles are not to be left unattended.
- There is a Permit Only Zone in front of the staff carpark. Please do not park here unless you have a permit.
- Abide by all road rules
- Use the crossings provided (manned or not) to cross the road
- Ensure children exit the car on the footpath side
- Encourage your children to stand on the footpath not on the road when leaving the car
- Be patient and respectful of other motorists




#### Description and educative purpose

The Year 1/2 students will celebrate our focus on push and pull forces through this hands-on toy incursion. Students will experience and understand push, pull, gravity and rotational inertia being lead by our visiting educators from Labcoat Learning. Each class will participate in a 50 minute session, drawing together our focus in STEM and Inquiry throughout Term 2.

## How to Reset Compass Password

If you require assistance with logging into Compass, you may have tried your password more than 3 times and Compass will lock you out of the system as a security measure. Please wait

approximately 30 minutes and try again.



If you are still not able to remember the correct password and are needing your password reset, you can do this via the Compass login screen.

By clicking this option you will be stepped through a series of questions including a request to enter your current email or mobile phone number. Compass will use the information to forward the reset details so you must be able to access your email / mobile phone. **Please note,** Compass will use the existing primary email or mobile on file for that user account for verification before completing a password reset for the user. If the mobile or email that they enter does not match what is on file they will not be able to proceed. For instances where it is Parent B of an account attempting to reset the password, the system will require Parent A's email/mobile as these details are considered the primary details for the household account.

If, after waiting 30 minutes and following the 'Cant access your account' instructions, please call or email the school office and we will attempt to assist you.
