Principal Report

Early arrival at school

We have noticed many students are arriving at school quite early, some as early as 8:15am. Just a reminder to all our families that our schoolyard is not supervised until 8:45am. Please ensure your child arrives around this time or utilise the OSHClub which operates from 7:00am in the Tydeman Arts Centre. This service is also available after school until 6:00pm. Our yard is supervised after school until 3:45pm. NB. During the ICAS assessments, younger siblings arriving with those students participating in these assessments **should not be left unattended in the yard.**

School Council

During the first week of term and early last week our Sub-committees met to discuss a number of topics which each group are focusing on this year.

The Community Engagement group continue to discuss Compass and how we can best utilise this platform within our school community. Our new website is not too far away and we thank one of our parents Gabby Wilson for working on the technical side of this project, with support from Kirsty G who is looking over this for us from a marketing and PR perspective. Our Leading Teachers, Miss Curtain and Mr Judkins have been working with different stakeholders on the update of the content and will review the final draft before it goes live. Thank you in advance to everyone involved.

The Education group have been discussing assessment, reporting and the new Victorian curriculum and plan to shortly gather some feedback from our families on the new curriculum and the current format of the report. After receiving some feedback from our community, we discussed some possible changes to the newly formulated Dogs on School Grounds policy after seeking advice from the department. There will be further communication on the changes over the next week.

Every month the Finance group look over our financial statements for the previous month and approve particular operating reports and statements as set out by School Council governance documents and DET.

Whilst Building and Grounds have not had a formal meeting this term, we have held Project day #3 where a lot of effort was put into the yard from a small but enthusiastic group. At our next meeting, we will move forward with making decisions and plans for the remainder of the year including the Buddy bench/ friendship area, a re-positioned sand pit and the new garden/ playground near our current 5/6 playground (which will need to be replaced!). Our CAR funding of \$229,000 is still awaiting approval from DET and we hope to see this moving a long soon.

School Council also met for its monthly meeting on Wednesday night. Whilst covering our regular committee reports and regular agenda items Simon Judkins and Stephen Gleeson also spoke about our vision for technology across the school over the next few years. We will share more about this in coming weeks. If our community have questions about School Council please don't hesitate to ask myself, staff

Parent Opinion Survey 2017

WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted **amongst a sample of randomly selected parents at each school.**

It is designed to assist our school in gaining an understanding of parents' perception of school climate, student engagement and relationships with our parent community. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

The survey will be conducted **online by ORIMA Research Pty Ltd** and will only takes **15 minutes** to complete. The survey can be accessed via desktop computer, laptop, tablet or mobile at any convenient time within the fieldwork period from **Monday 7th August to Sunday 27th August.**

Over 100 families will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous.

The online survey is available in English, Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (Hakha) and Hindi. Survey language guides will be provided in a range of languages including Albanian, Bengali, Burmese, Cantonese, Dari, Filipino, Greek, Gujarati, Indonesian, Japanese, Karen, Khmer, Korean, Macedonian, Malayalam, Pashto, Persian, Punjabi, Russian, Serbian,

Sinhalese, Somali, Spanish, Tagalog, Tamil, Telugu, Turkish or Urdu.

The survey results will be reported back to our school at the end of September..
