The Quest – Term 3

The focus questions/concepts which inquiry units at each level will be based around, stemming from the whole school essential question – How does the world work? are as follows:

(Foundation) The Earth and me

Level 1 How does the weather affect us?
Level 2 How does the Earth impact us?
Level 3 The Earth, moon and sun
Level 4 The Earth beneath our feet

Level 5 The Solar System

Level 6 Natural Disasters/geological events

Classroom Libraries & Independent Reading

This term you will notice every classroom has a new set of bookshelves filled with lots of books to support our classroom reading programs. So what is independent reading and why do we do it? At Camelot Rise we make decisions about curriculum and teaching practice and pedagogy based on evidence and research – what we know works!

Independent Reading

Is NOT silent reading, or free reading! It is the end result of a well-executed balanced literacy program. It allows students the chance to 'practice' the strategies they've learned through guided reading, shared reading and read aloud – the other components of a balanced Literacy program. With level appropriate materials (just right books) students develop the skills and strategies they need to read on their own, resulting in more confident and excited approaches to reading.

Classroom Libraries

Classroom libraries are one important part of a Literacy-rich environment. They offer opportunities for students to engage in texts that reflect their interests and support class reading as there is easier and more equitable access to texts located not only on a shelf but displayed through the classroom.

Students play an integral role in the development of the classroom library by being involved in the continual, revolving selection of texts.

We know that student ownership and participation in the classroom library helps foster reading engagement.

Each term we run optional lunchtime activities for all students from Foundation through to Level 6. A reminder of what is on this Term is as follows:




Reminder to parents to log onto Compass and enter any student absence as per following instructions.



Child Care Rebate (CCR)

Most families are eligible for the 50% rebate of all out of pocket expenses for attending OSHClub programs. Many families are getting half their fees back as an immediate discount when they ask for their rebate to be applied to their account. Please note the CCR is not means tested.

Changes to the CCR payment method can be made online at www.humanservices.gov.au or alternatively call 13 61 50, give your Customer Reference Number (CRN), enter your PIN (if you have one) then say 'Child Care Rebate Options' and follow the prompts. Ask for your Child Care Rebate to be paid 'directly' to OSHClub on your behalf as a fee reduction.
